

Greyhound places in SW London & Surrey

Pubs etc.

The following places to eat are dog-friendly and serve decent food:

- The Dysart Arms, Petersham. Good food, semi-restaurant, best for dogs at lunch time (noisy in evenings, but dogs still ok). Opposite an entrance to Richmond Park – so possible to have a drink/food in the pub then walk the hound in Richmond Park leaving the car behind the pub. www.thedysartarms.co.uk;
- The Petersham Nursery Tea House. Restaurant famous for its food and celebs, but closed to dogs. However the Tea House is fine with dogs and has lots of tables set in a greenhouse full of herbs. Parking is trouble, so best to park nearby and walk there (or even park at Marble Hill on the other side of the river and take the summer passenger ferry over). <http://www.petershamnurseries.com/cafeandteahouse.asp>
- The White Swan, Richmond. Good food, famous meeting place close to the river. Best for dogs at lunch time (noisy in evenings). <http://www.whiteswanrichmond.co.uk> ;
- The White Cross, Richmond. On the river front in the town centre by Richmond Bridge. Big pub on two floors (upstairs usually almost empty at lunch times). Good views;
- The New Inn, Ham. Opposite Ham Common and close to Richmond Park's Ham gate. Traditional pub with pub food;
- The Bear, Oxshott. Good food, popular pub so get there before 1:00pm. Hounds welcome both inside and in the covered outside areas. www.thebearoxshott.co.uk/ ;
- The Running Horses, Mickleham near Dorking. Traditional pub with pub food, parking in side road. Can get very busy after 12:30. <http://www.therunninghorses.co.uk/>;
- The Admiral Codrington, Chelsea. Outstanding food, dogs welcome in bar area. www.theadmiralcodrington.co.uk/;

Off-lead enclosed

The following areas are enclosed and welcome dogs running off-lead:

- Bedfont Park, Feltham. Specially constructed dog off-lead area with good fencing, rough grass, poo-bins, and off-road parking. About 2 acres. www.bedfontlakes.co.uk/ ;
- Suffolk Road, Barnes. Ex-playing area with good fencing, short grass, poo-bins, and on-road parking. About 1 acre;
- Kempton Park Racecourse. Right next to Gate 6 entrance to the Racecourse (on the A308) is a large area fully fenced to about 8 foot high which is open to the public during daylight hours;

- Polesden Lacey, Surrey. This great National Trust site (members free) has a very large field ("The Golf Field") on the left side of the main drive after the gate house. Ok for dogs off-lead in winter, maybe in summer too. Good fencing, rough grass, and off-road parking in the general car park. About 30 acres;
- Toplands at Manor Farm Country Park in Hampshire, ½ mile from junction 8 of the M27. The field is about 1-2 acres and is fully fenced with a secure gate. There is parking by the field and a doggy-poo bin is provided (there is also a drinking trough too).
